
THE DOMAIN AT A GLANCE

Heritage and Libraries bring together over **2,400 establishments** with employees nationwide.


The domain contributed a total of \$0.6 billion to Canada's GDP, or 1.4% of the cultural sector's overall economic contribution from cultural products in Canada.

Establishments covered by this domain include museums, art galleries, historic sites, buildings, community and nature parks, exhibition centres, planetariums, aquariums, zoos, and botanical gardens.

BREAKDOWN OF CULTURAL SECTOR GDP (\$ BILLION)




EMPLOYMENT BREAKDOWN BY REGION (%)



SHARE OF WORKING PART TIME






EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT DISTRIBUTION (%)

DISTRIBUTION OF EMPLOYEES vs. SELF-EMPLOYED (%)



DOMAIN'S DISTINCT FEATURES*

- Two thirds of workers are found in technical and operational occupations.
- Less than 5 % of workers are self-employed, compared with 28 % in the cultural sector overall.
- More than one in five workers work part-time, compared to one in ten in the cultural sector.
- The average annual income for heritage and libraries workers is 4% below the average of the cultural sector and 14% below the average for the Canadian economy.
- The domain's workforce is older than the average for the cultural sector and the overall economy. One in four workers in Heritage and Libraries is older than 55 years old, compared with one in five in the broader cultural sector and the economy.
